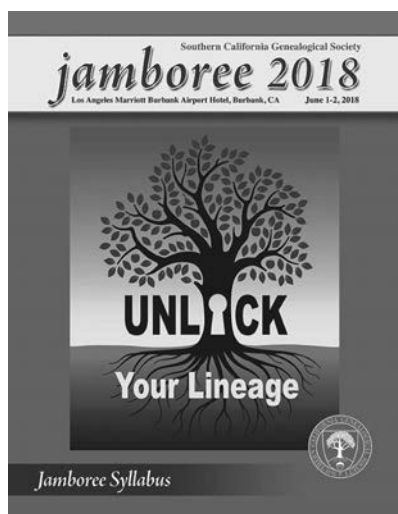

Please take a few minutes to read the information contained in this document. You will have a much better Jamboree experience if you do.

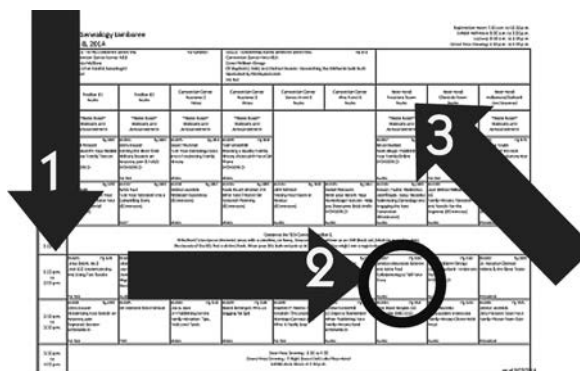

Parking at the Los Angeles Marriott Hotel and Alternate Parking at the Burbank Airport

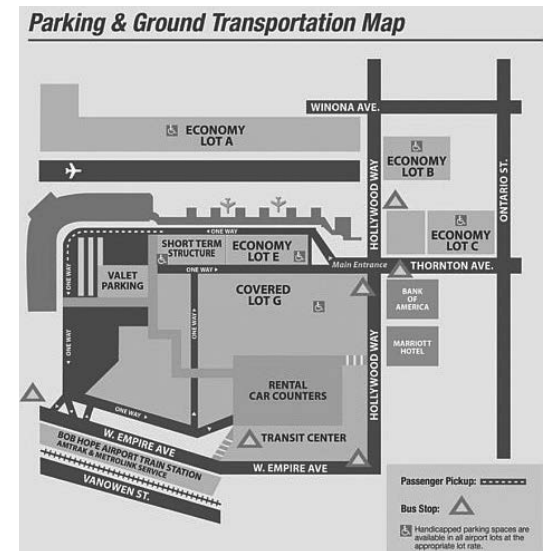

- (2) material is not shared in full.

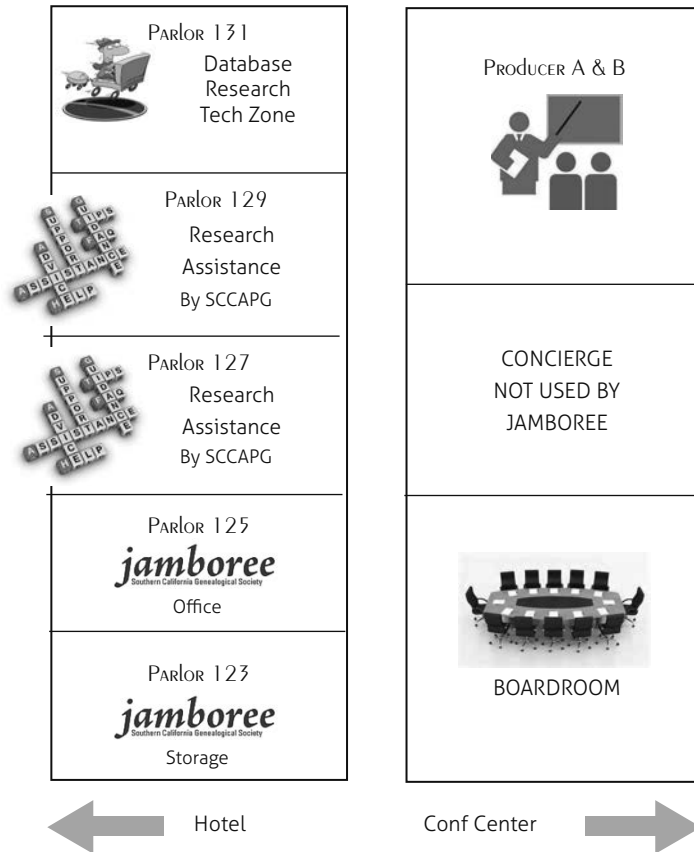

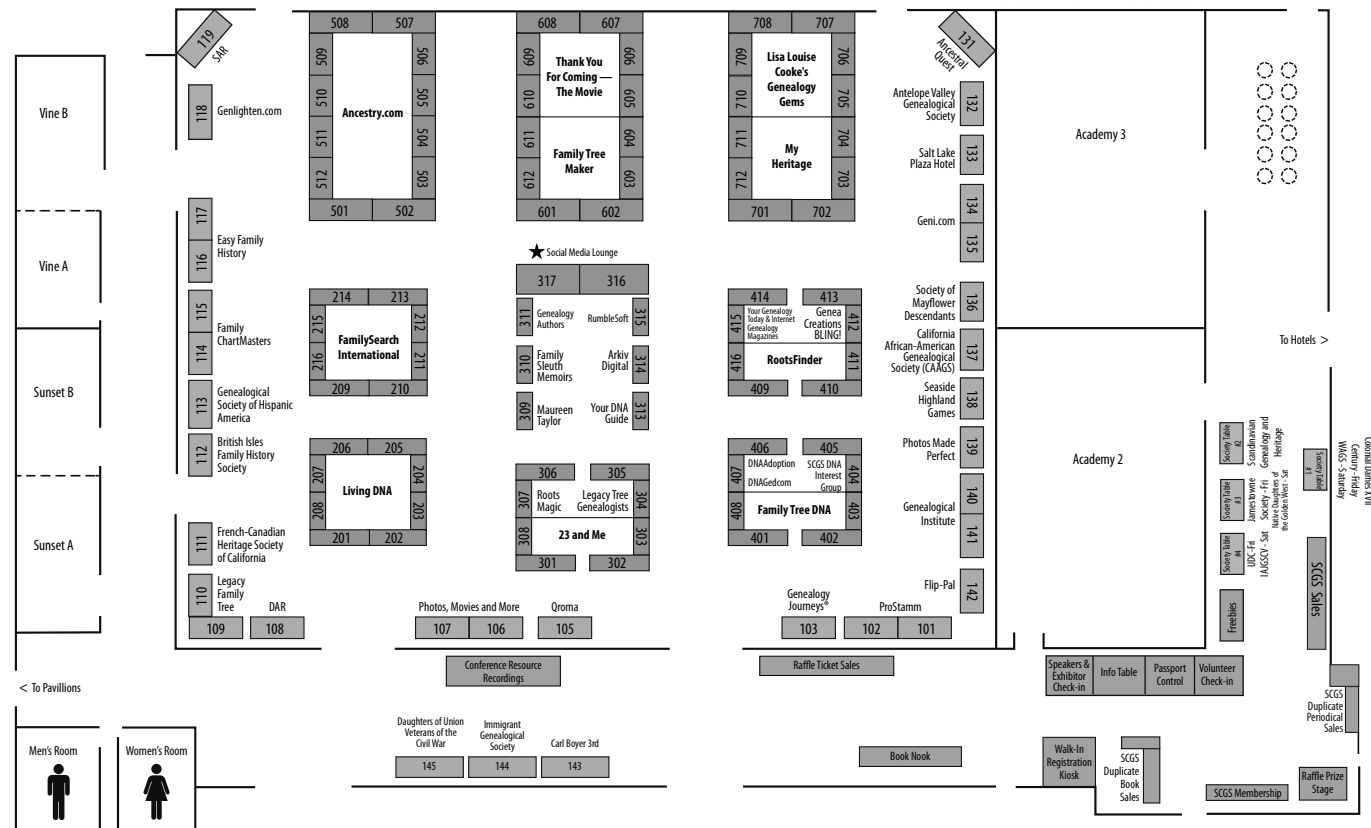

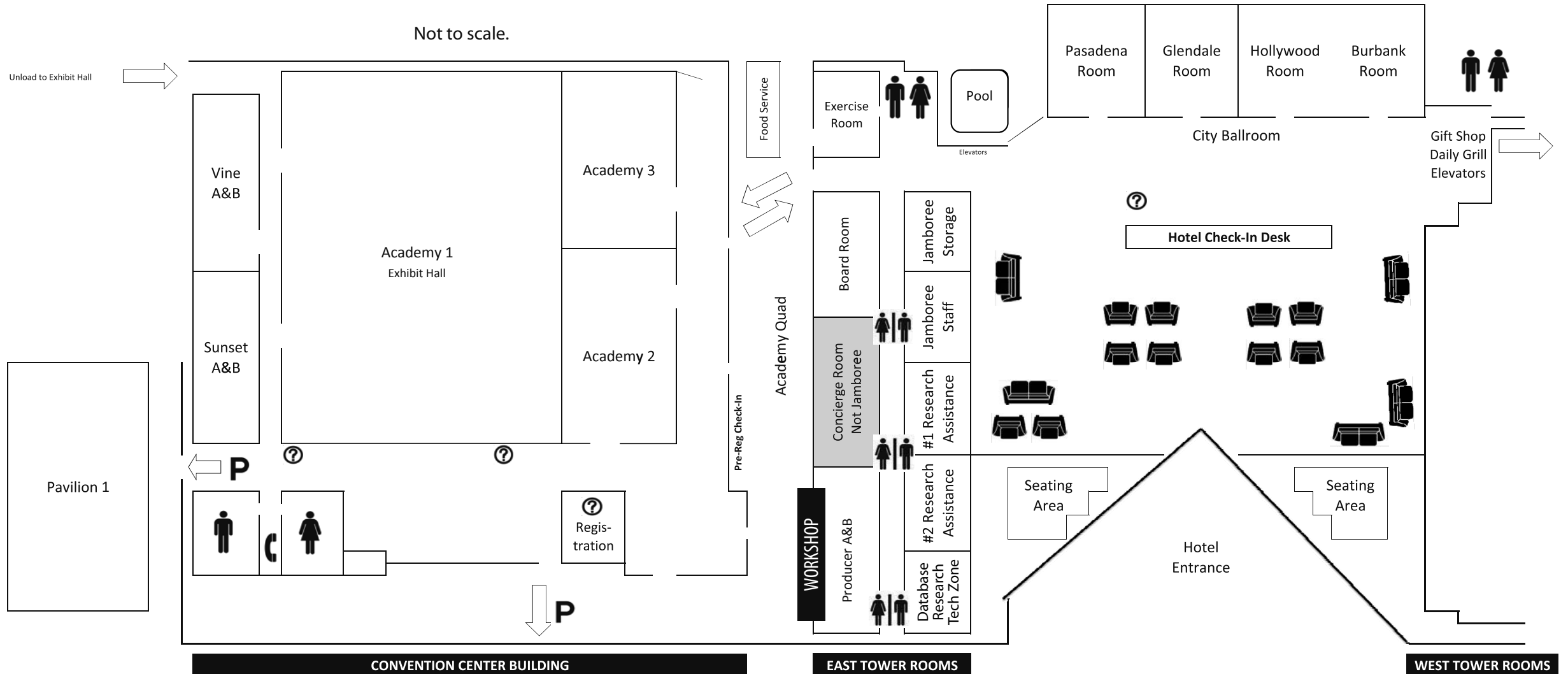
