“Saved” seats will be released 3 minutes prior to the beginning of the session. One person can save no more than two additional seats.

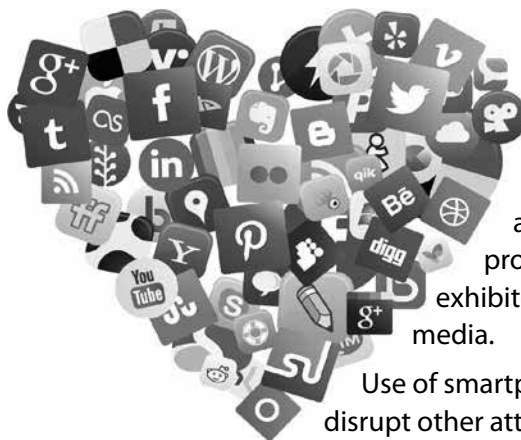

Parking at the Los Angeles Marriott Hotel and Alternate Parking at the Burbank Airport

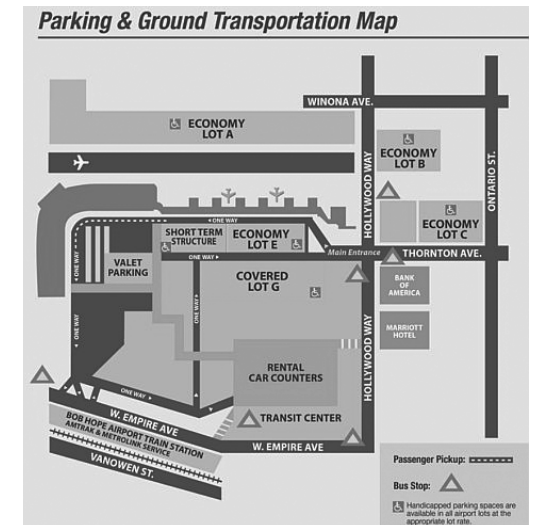

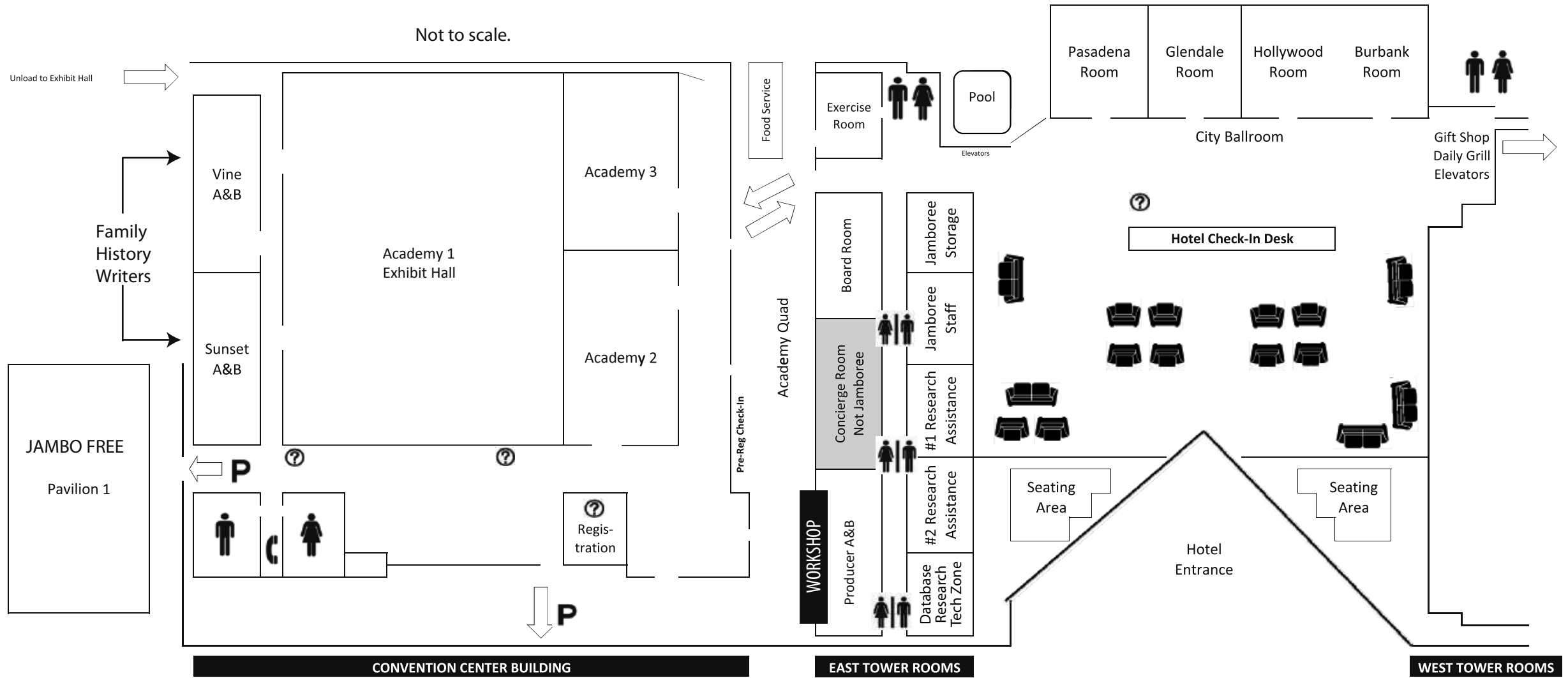
